
The Opportunity

Cinderford Town Council, with the support of Forest of Dean Council has been successful in being shortlisted for the final funding stage of the Future High Streets Fund run by the Government.

"The objective of the Fund is to renew and reshape town centres and high streets in a way that improves experience, drives growth and ensures future sustainability. "

What Will It Fund?

- Investment in physical infrastructure
- Acquisition and assembly of land including to support new housing, workspaces and public realm
- Improvements to transport access, traffic flow and circulation in the area
- Supporting change of use including (where appropriate) housing delivery and densification
- Supporting adaptation of the high street in response to changing technology

- Pedestrian activity has gone down





Key Proposals

- Safeguarding the future of the Methodist Church for community activities
- Improvements to Rheola House so that it is fully occupied by local enterprise
- Acorn House is improved for affordable family living units (*subject to planning consent and leasehold arrangements)
- Enhancements to the car park area and frontages so that all of the buildings are tied together through landscaping and a better environment
- Better management of parking across the whole site




Key Proposals


- Site becomes vacant and transferred to Town Council once new surgery has been built and opened on Valley Road
